The College of Charleston is a state-supported comprehensive institution providing a high-quality education in the arts and sciences, education and business. The faculty is an important source of knowledge and expertise for the community, state and nation.

Consistent with its heritage since its founding in 1770, the College retains a strong liberal arts undergraduate curriculum. Located in the heart of historic Charleston, it strives to meet the growing educational demands primarily of the Lowcountry and the state and, secondarily, of the Southeast. A superior undergraduate program is central to the mission of the College of Charleston. As a prominent component of the state's higher education system, the College encourages and supports research.

The College of Charleston serves a diverse student body from its geographic area and also attracts students from national and international communities. The College provides students a community in which to engage in original inquiry and creative expression in an atmosphere of intellectual freedom. This community, founded on the principles of the liberal arts tradition, provides students the opportunity to realize their intellectual and personal potential and to become responsible, productive members of society.

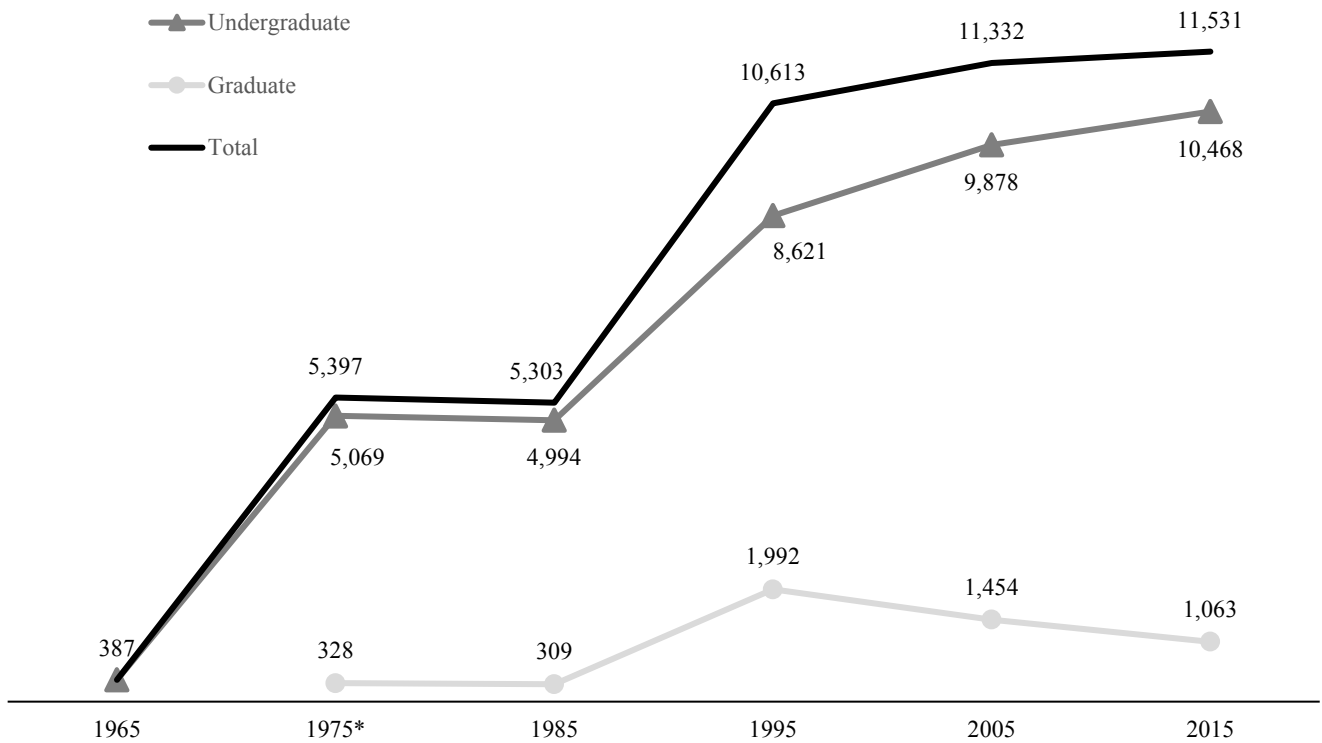

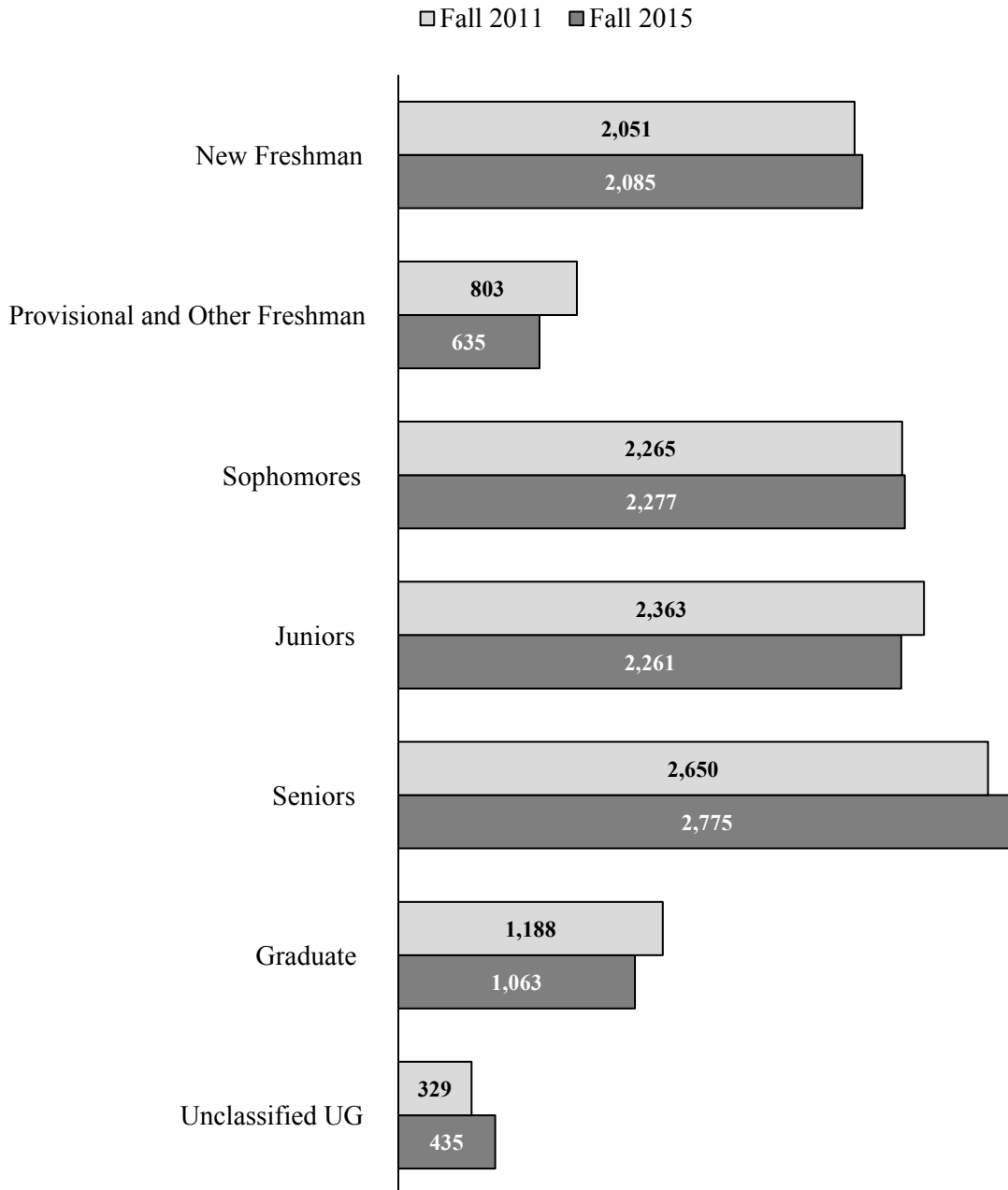

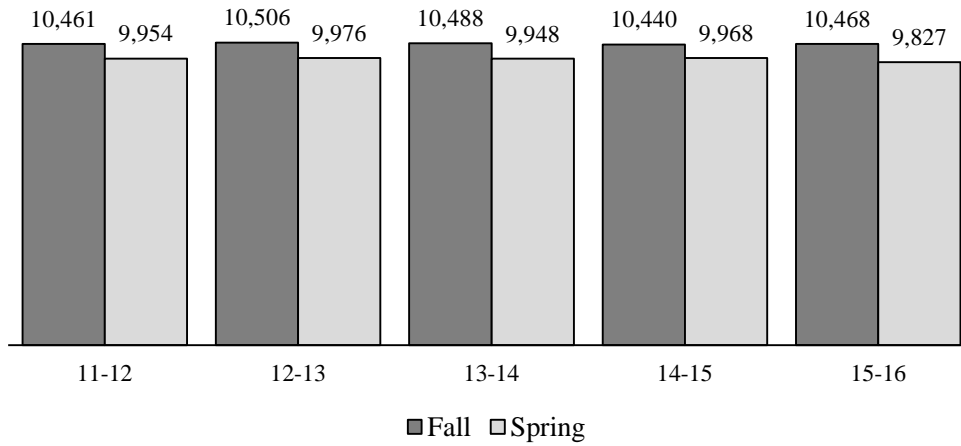
Student Headcounts by Class

Comparison of Fall 2011 and Fall 2015

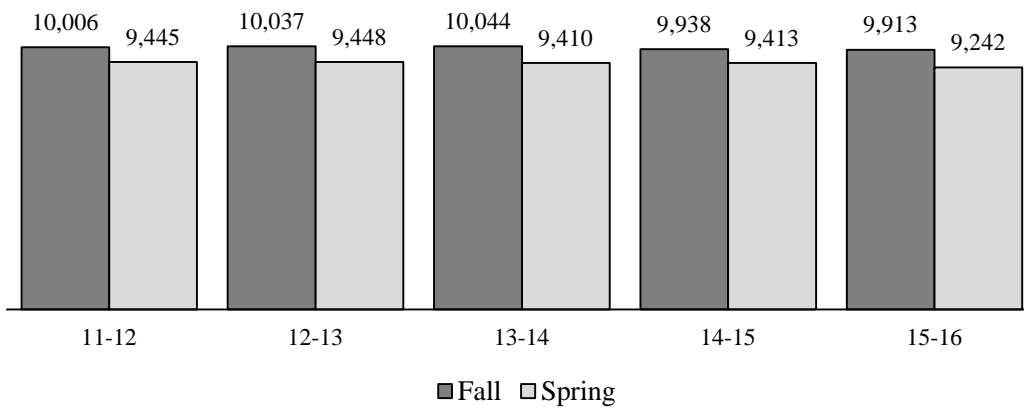


Undergraduate Student Headcount and FTE: Fall and Spring Semesters 2011-12 to 2015-16

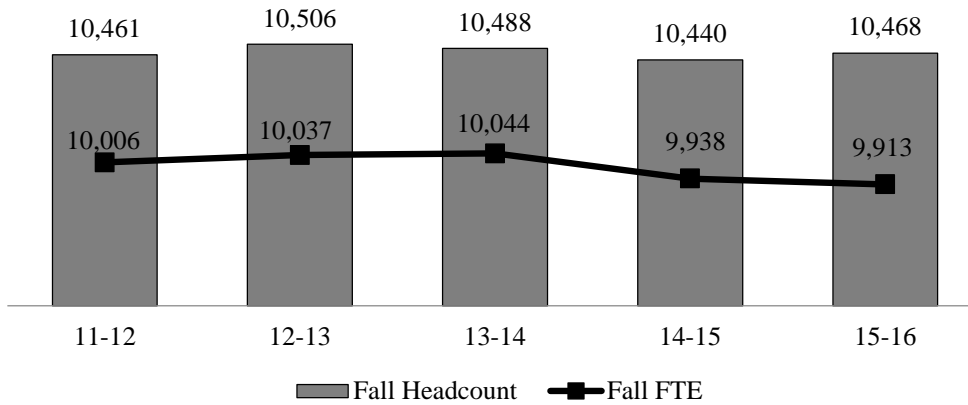

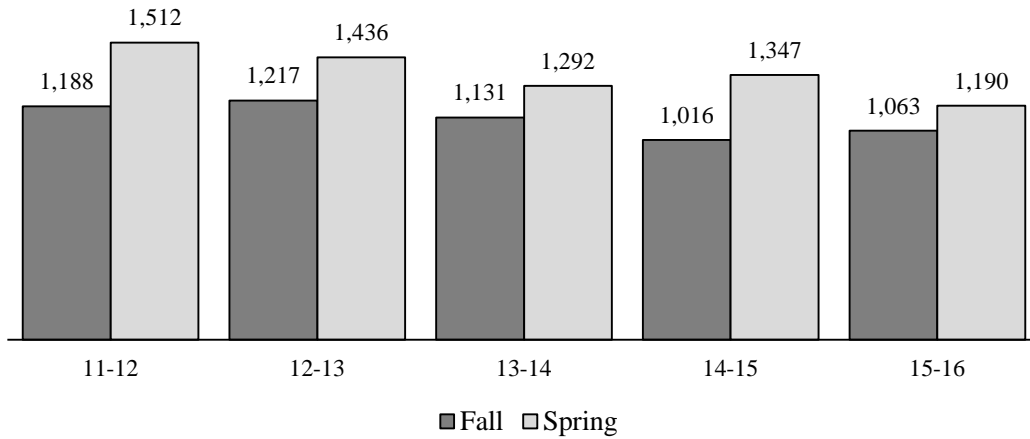


Fall Headcount to Fall FTE Ratio

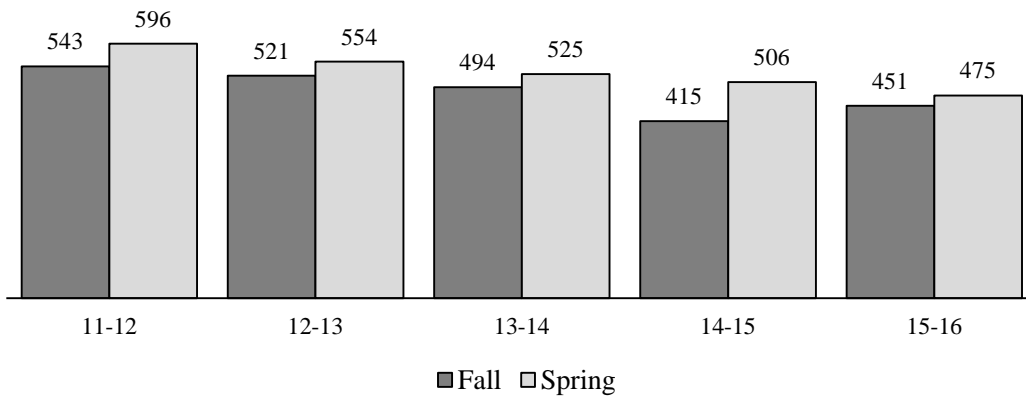

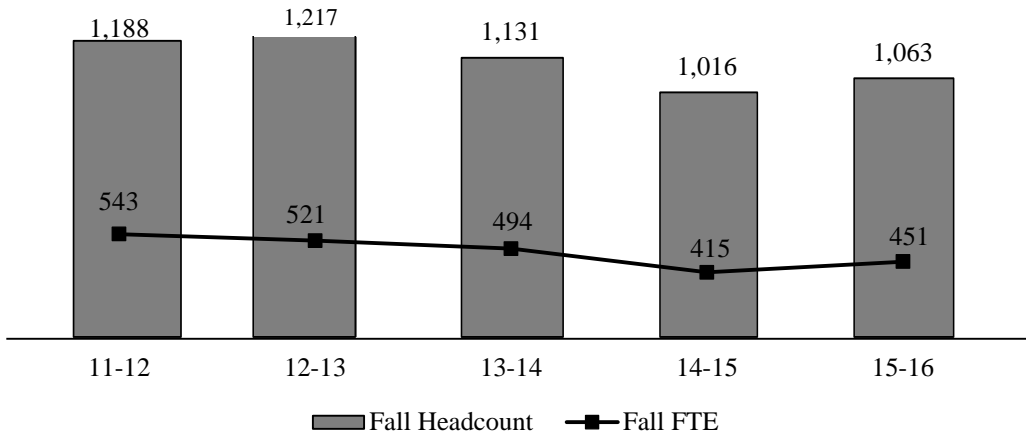

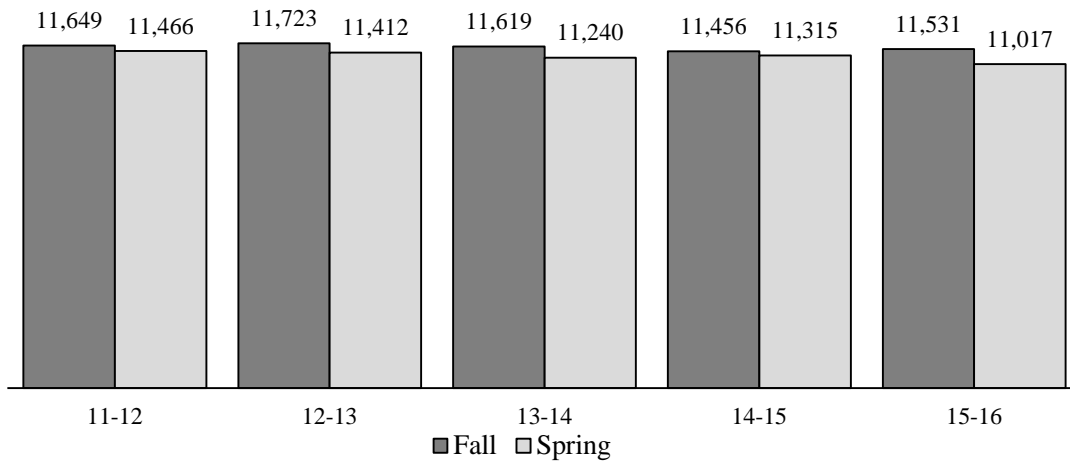
Fall Headcount to Fall FTE Ratio



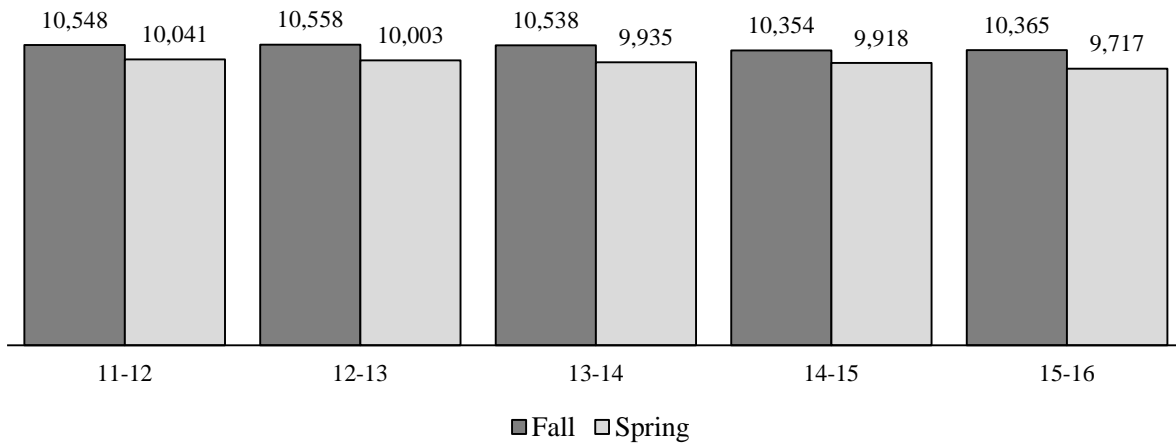
Total Student Headcount and FTE: Fall and Spring Semesters

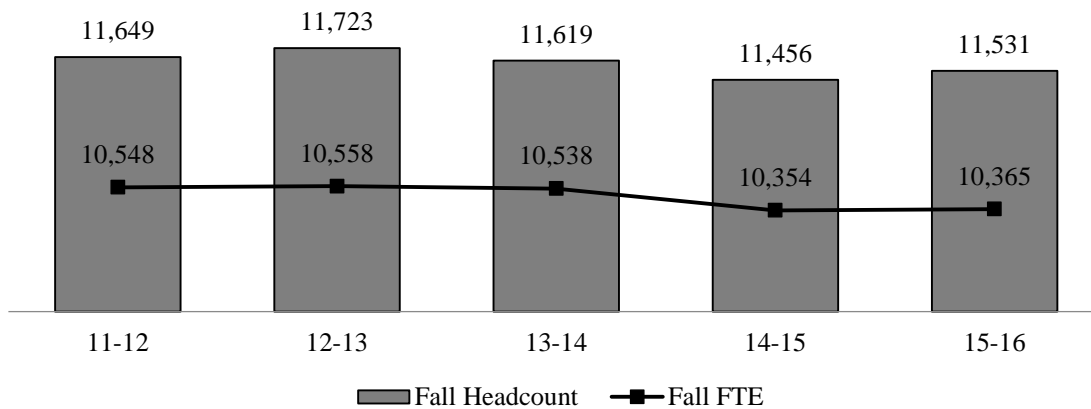

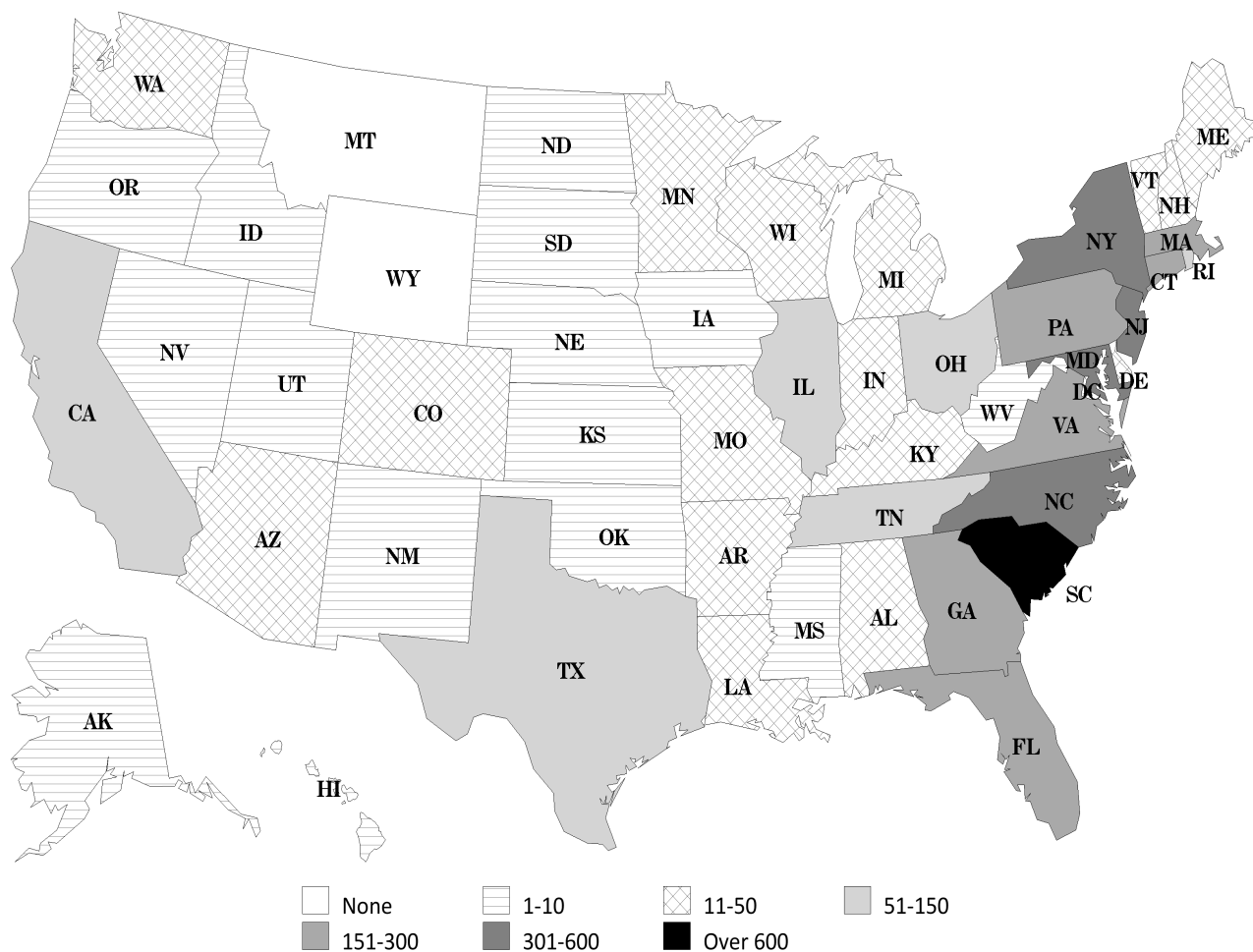

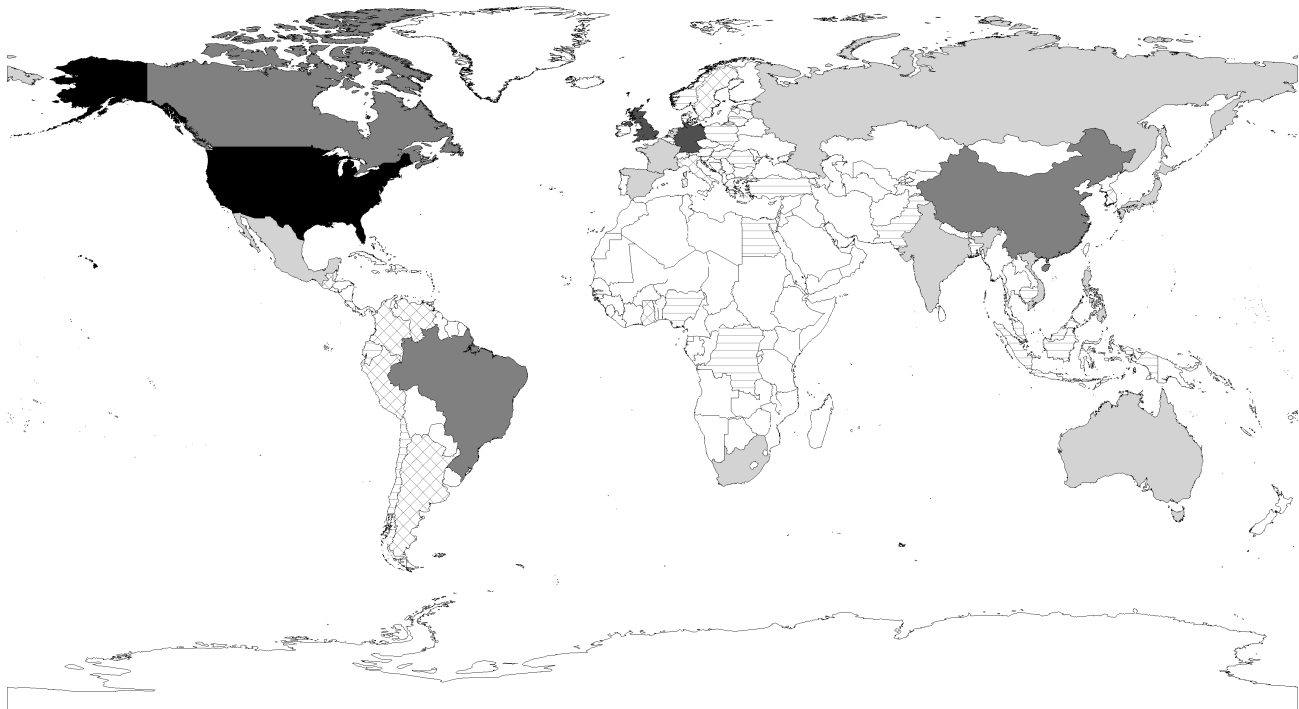

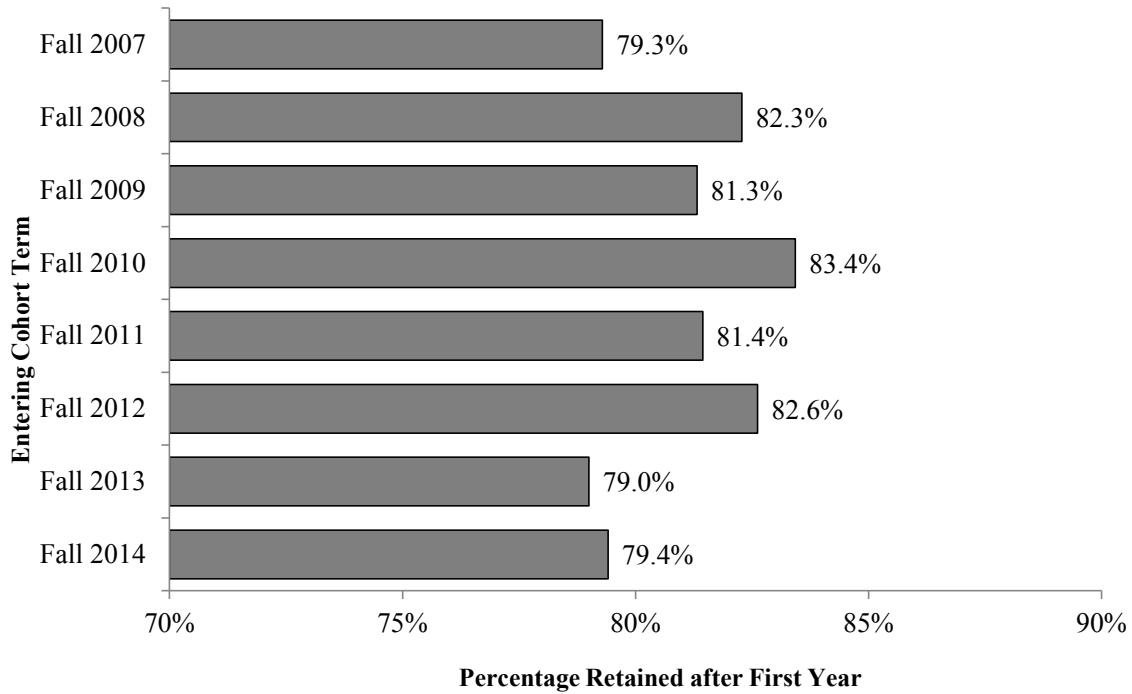

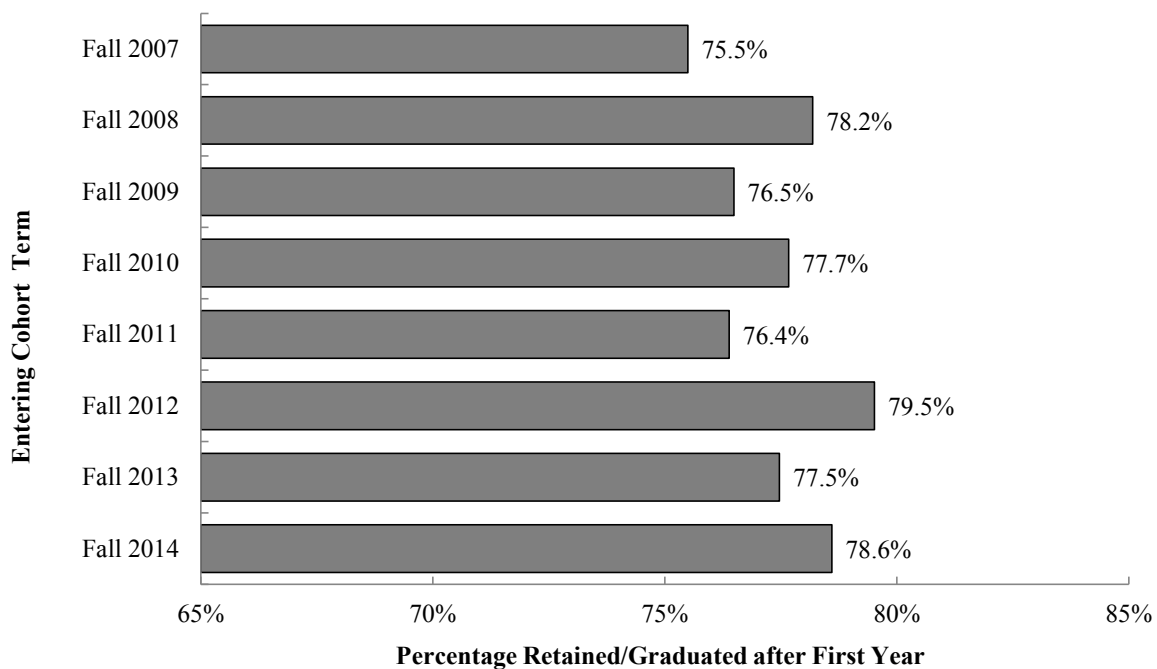

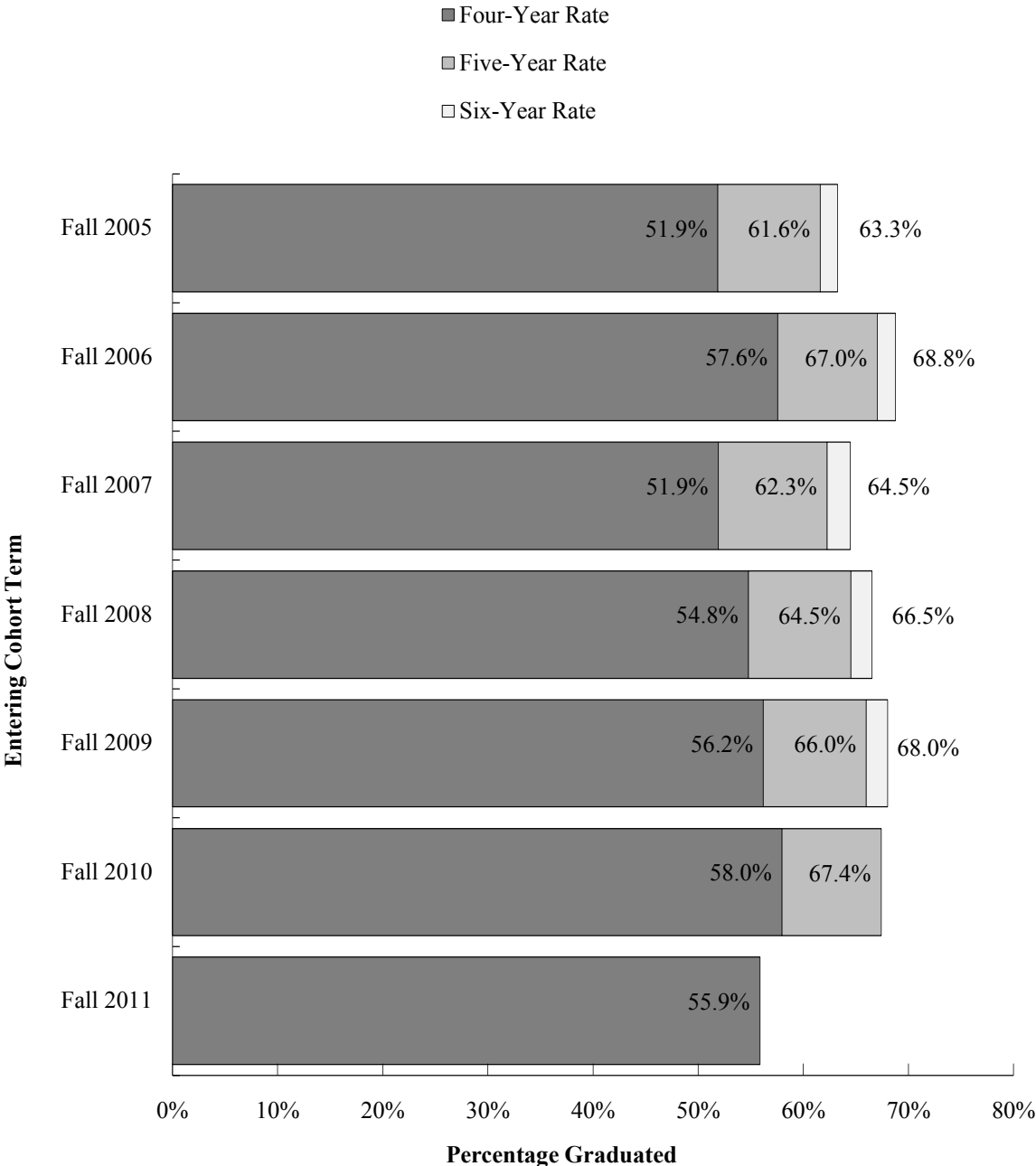
**First-Year Retention Rates of All New, Full-Time Freshmen

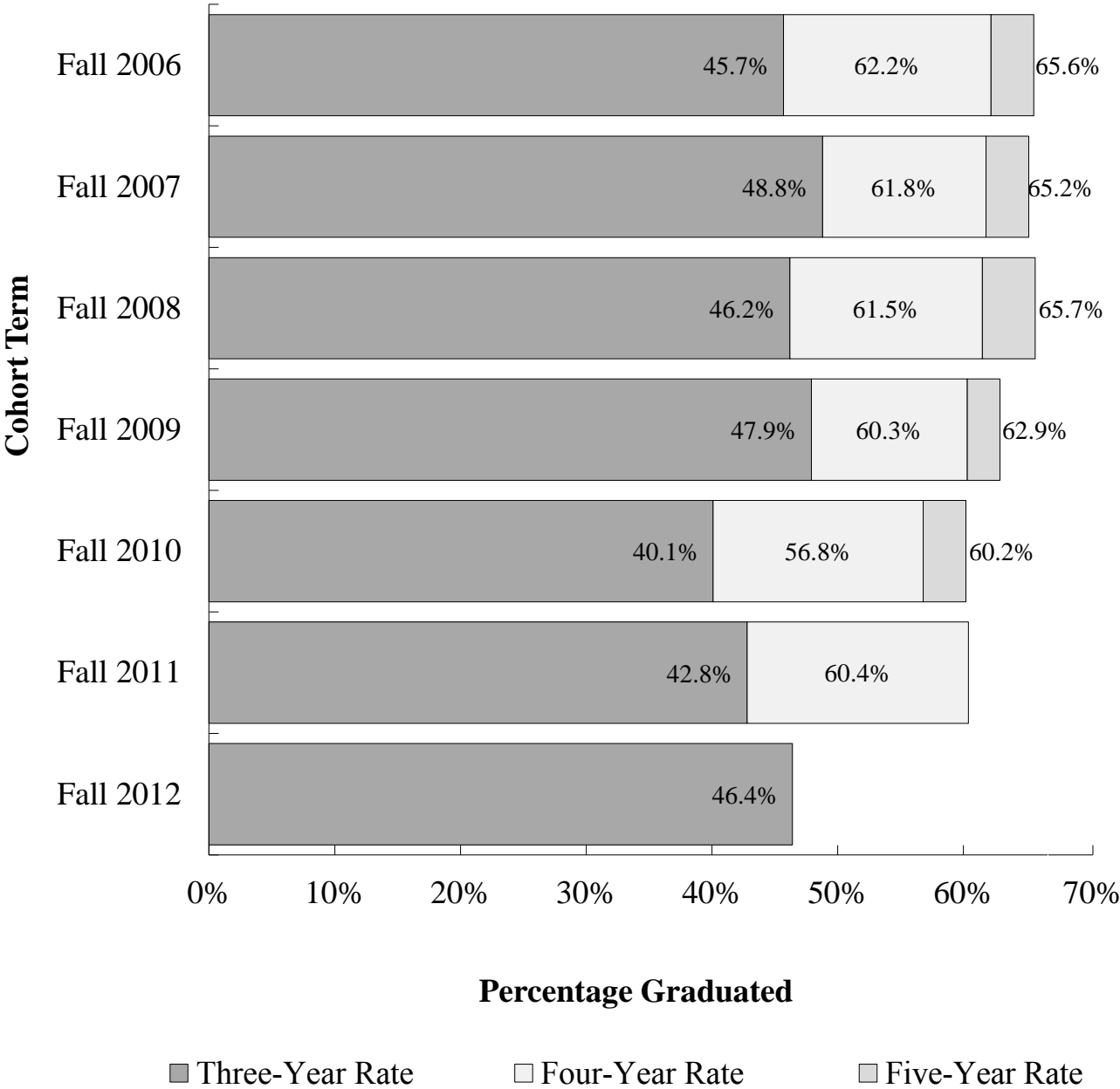

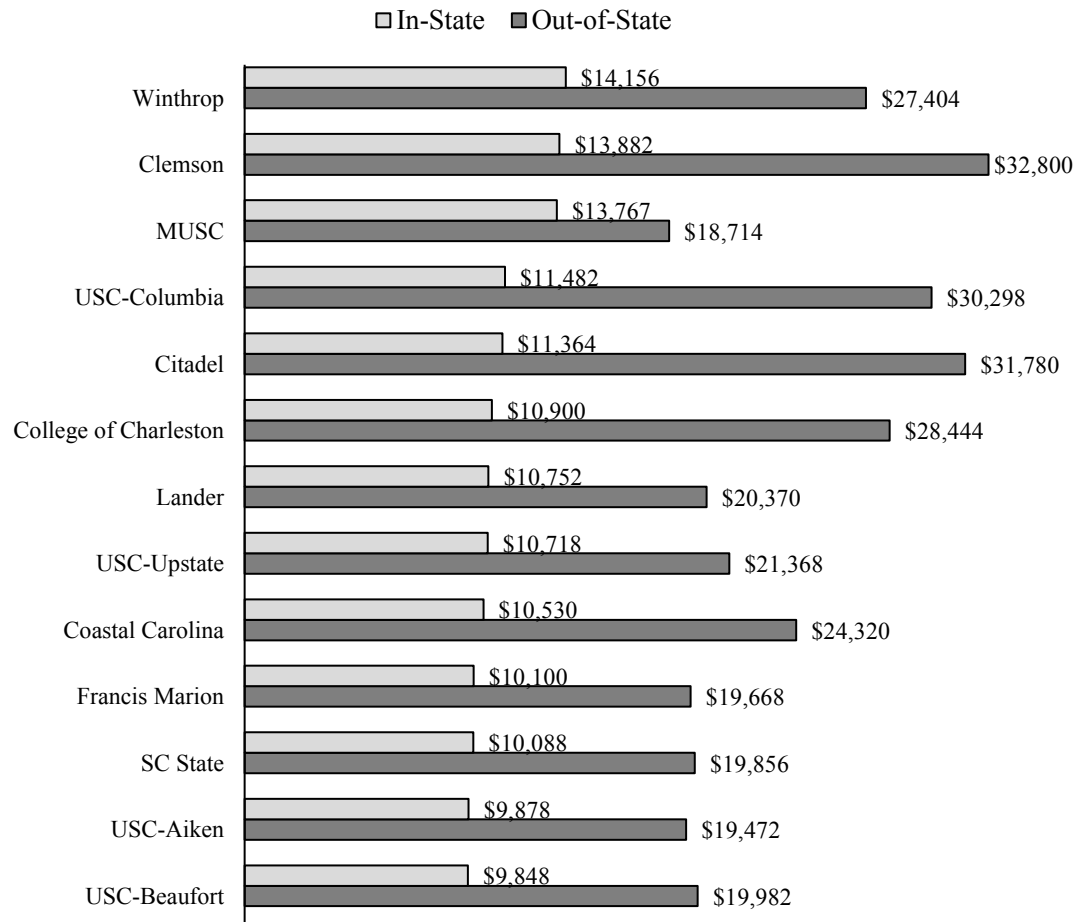
Graduation Rates of New Full-time Transfers Cohort Year 2006 to Cohort Year 2012

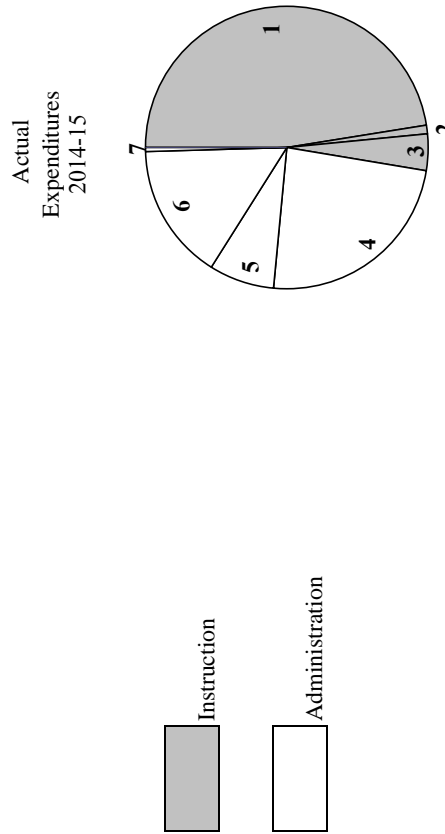
