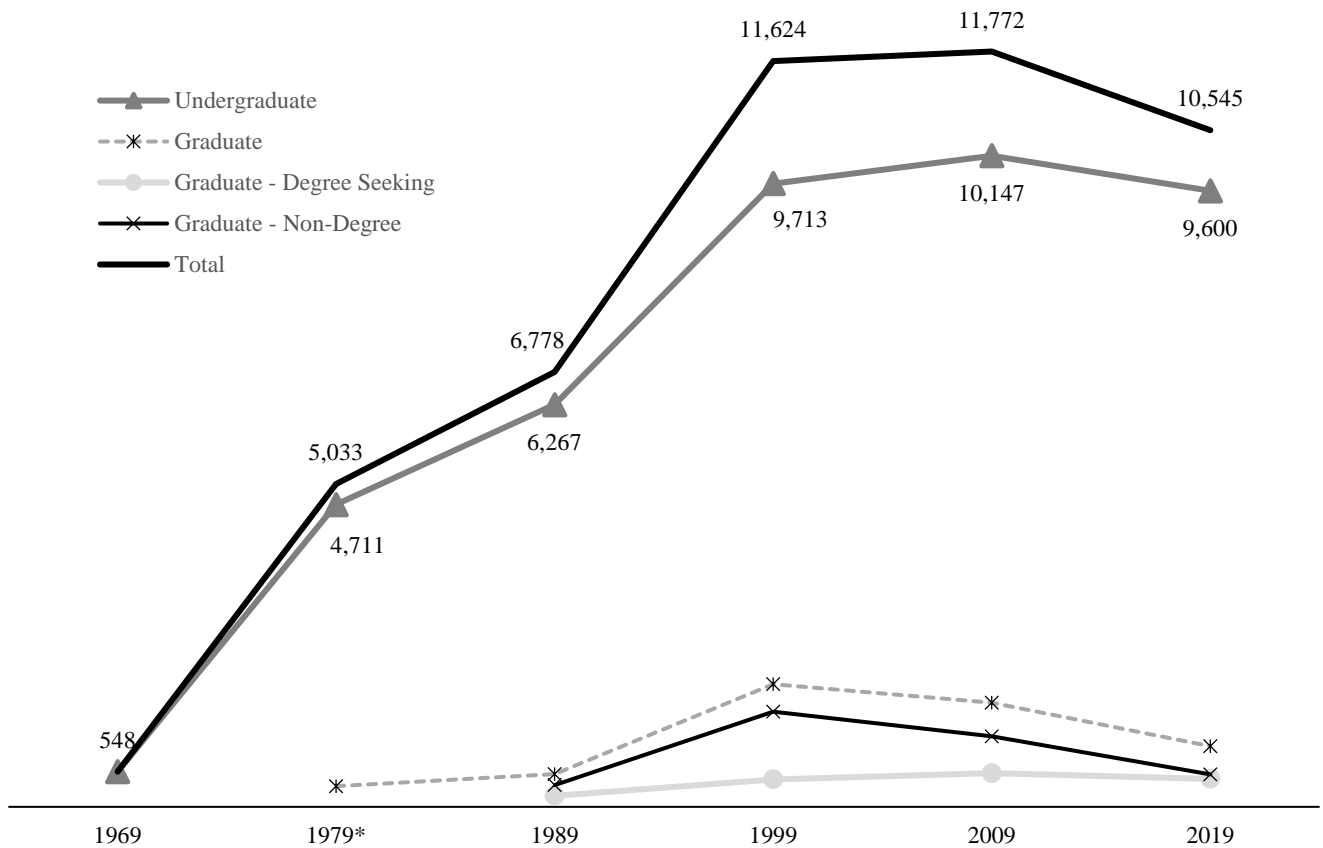

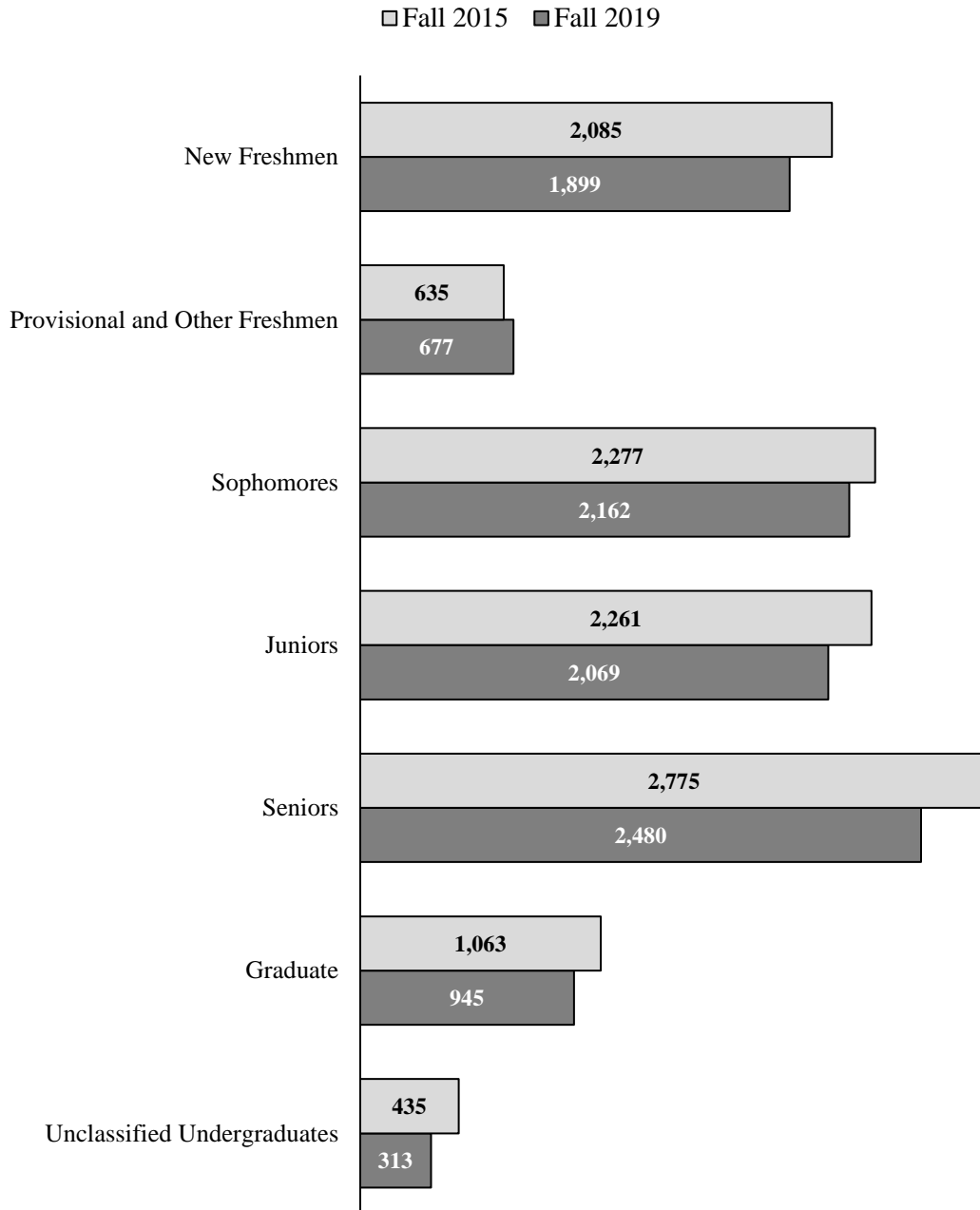

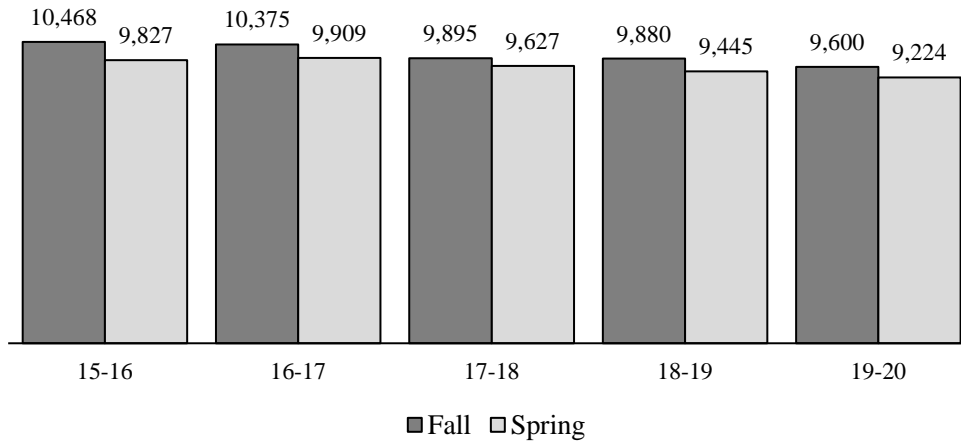


### Student Headcounts by Class Comparison of Fall 2015 and Fall 2019

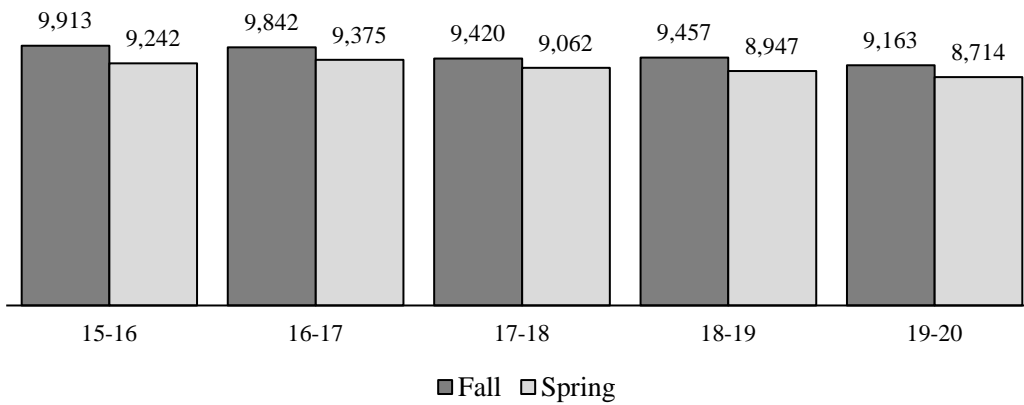


## Undergraduate Student Headcount and FTE: Fall and Spring Semesters 2015-16 to 2019-20

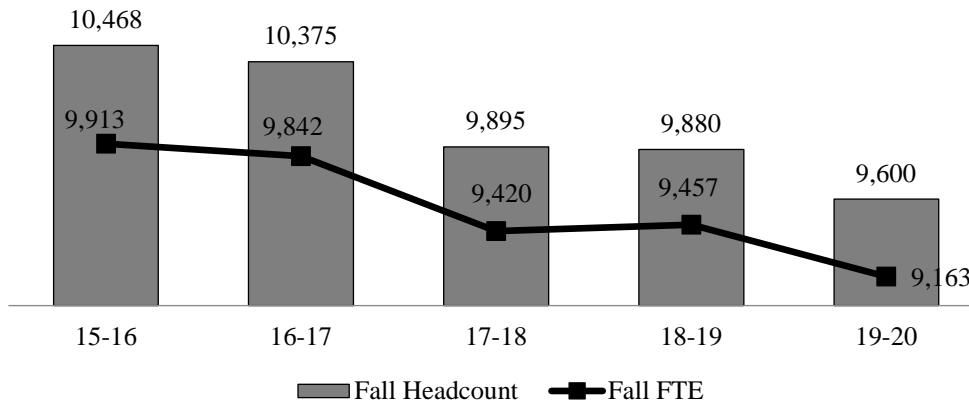

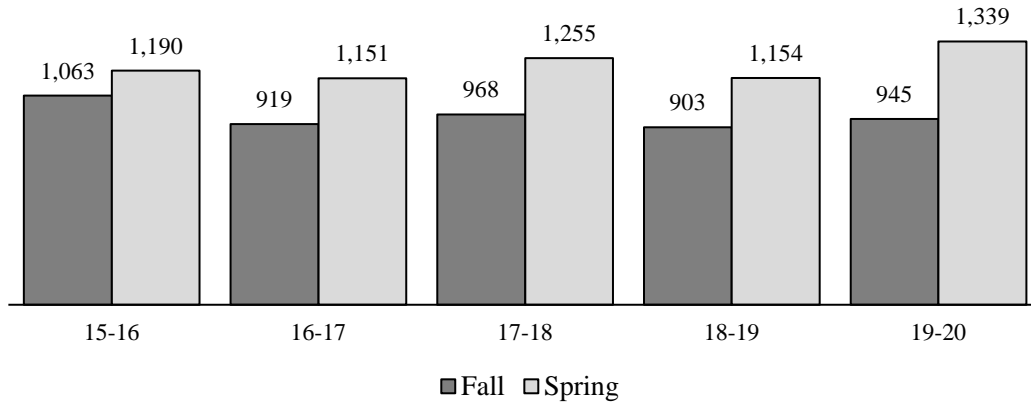

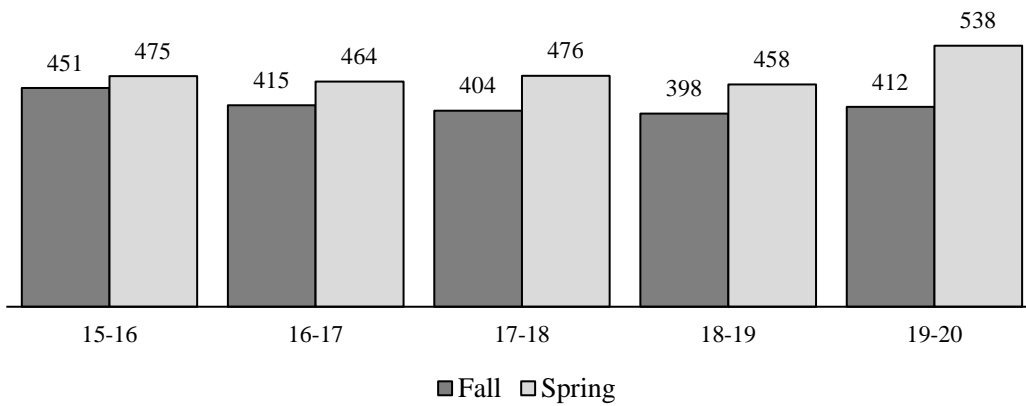


## Graduate Student Headcount and FTE: Fall and Spring Semesters 2015-16 to 2019-20

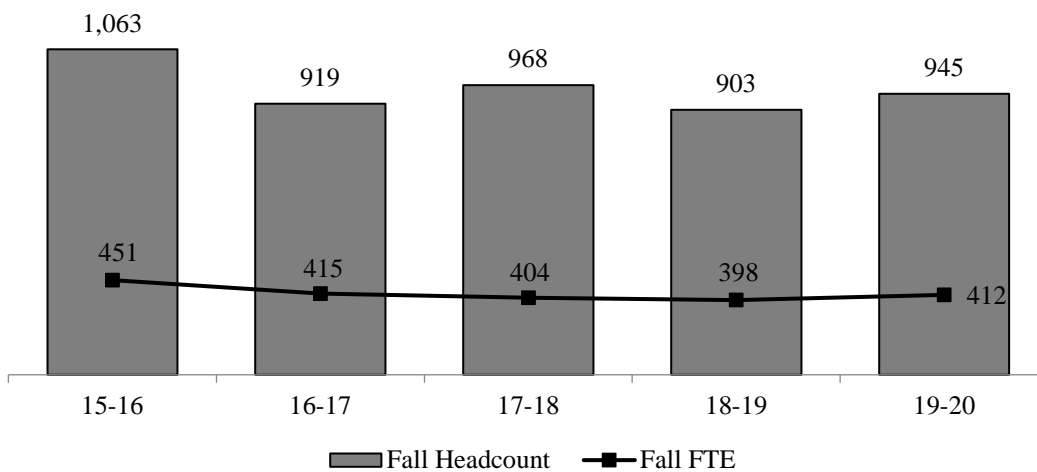

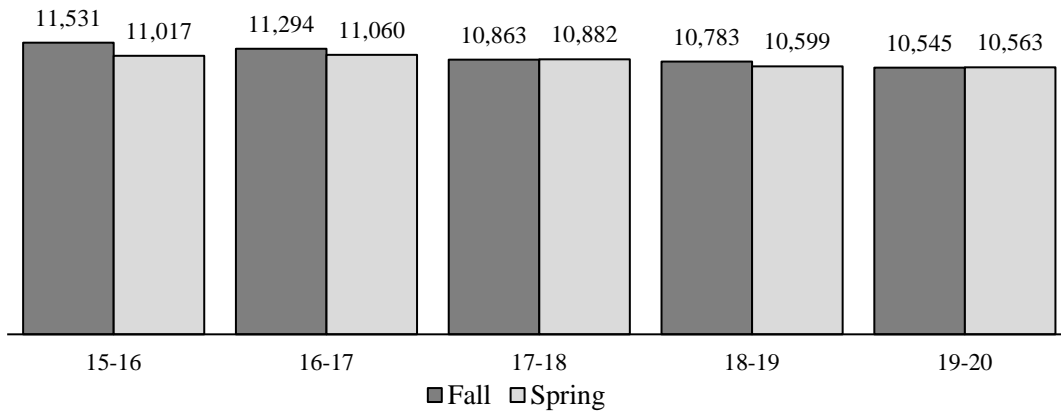

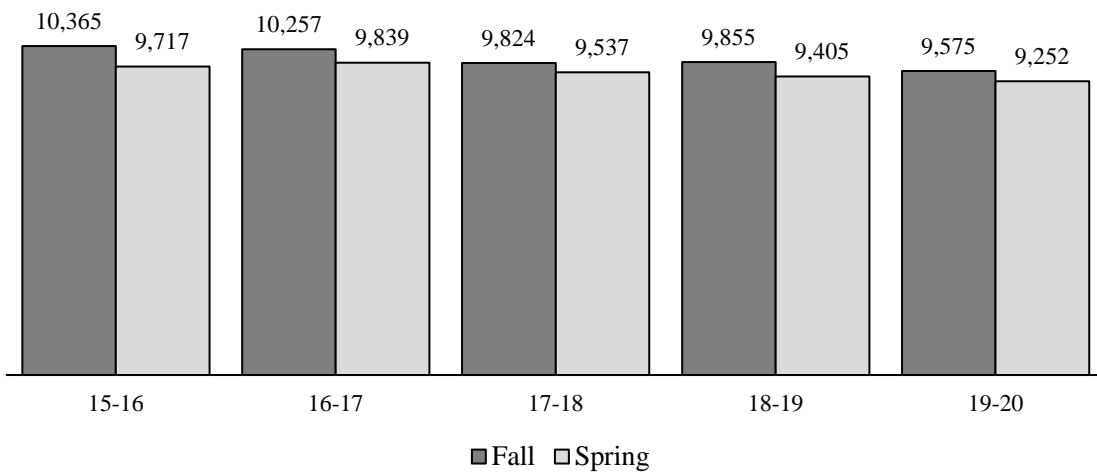


### Total Student Headcount and FTE: Fall and Spring Semesters 2015-16 to 2019-20

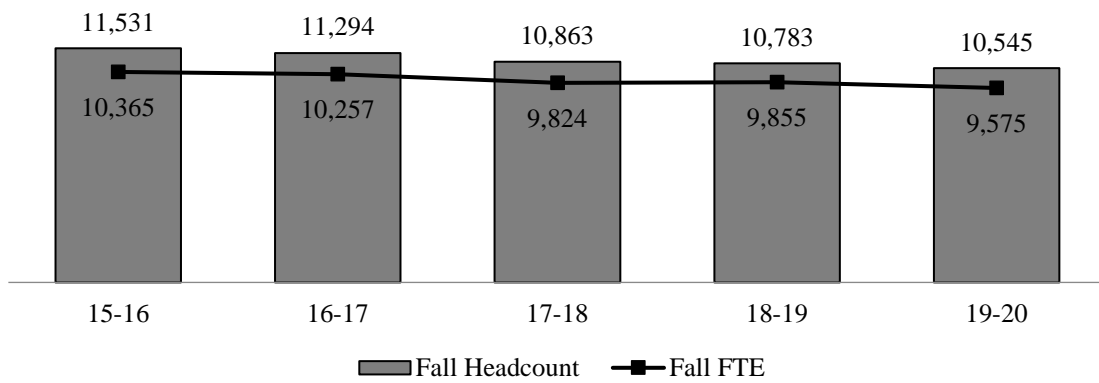

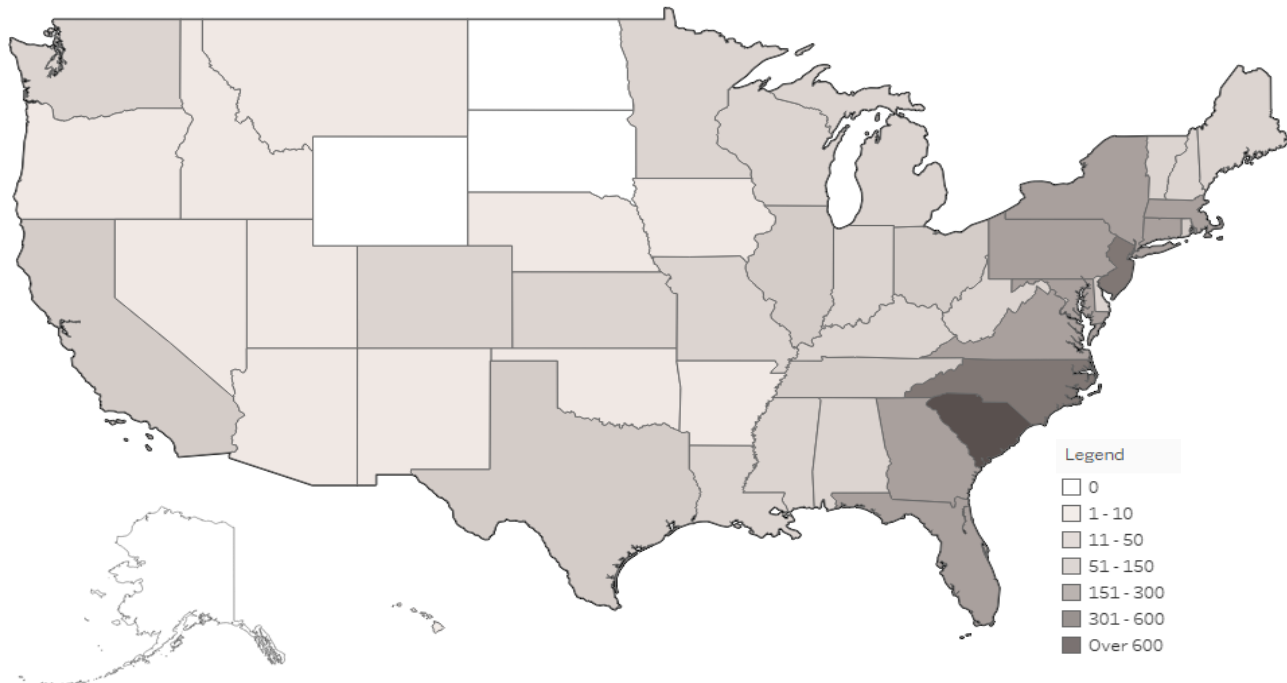

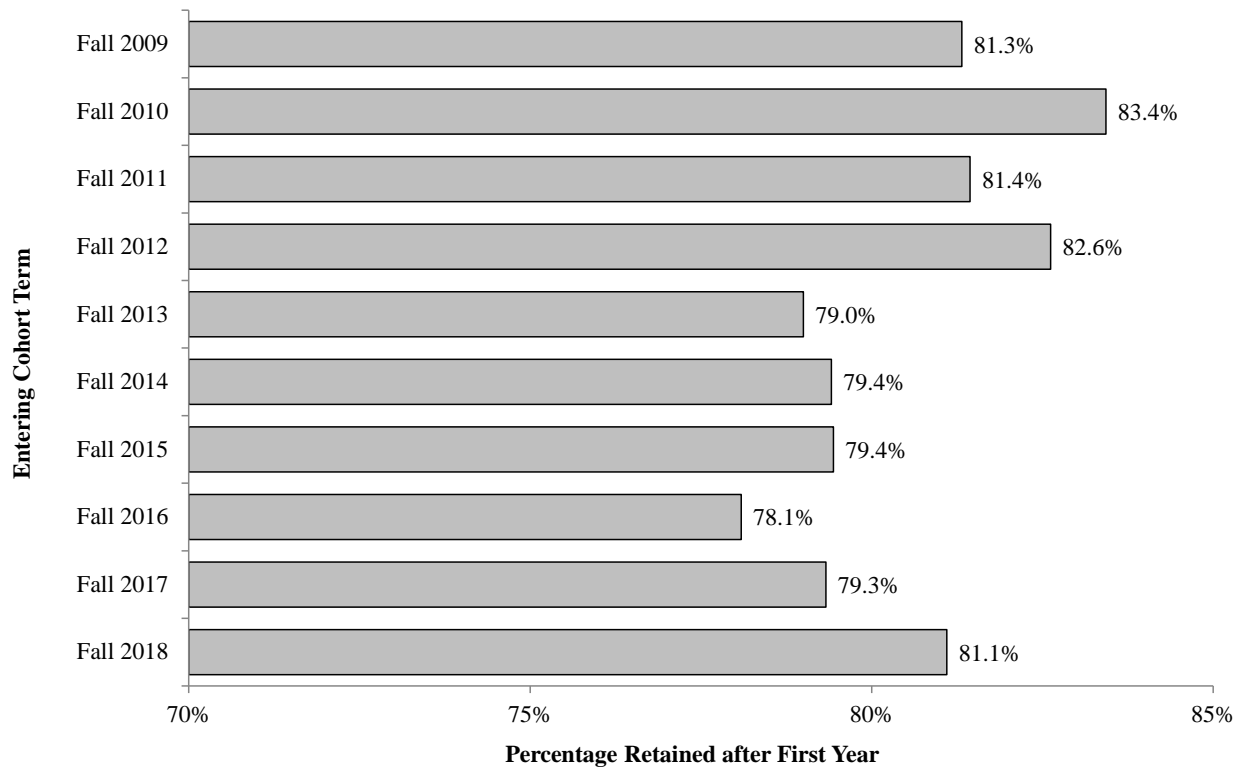

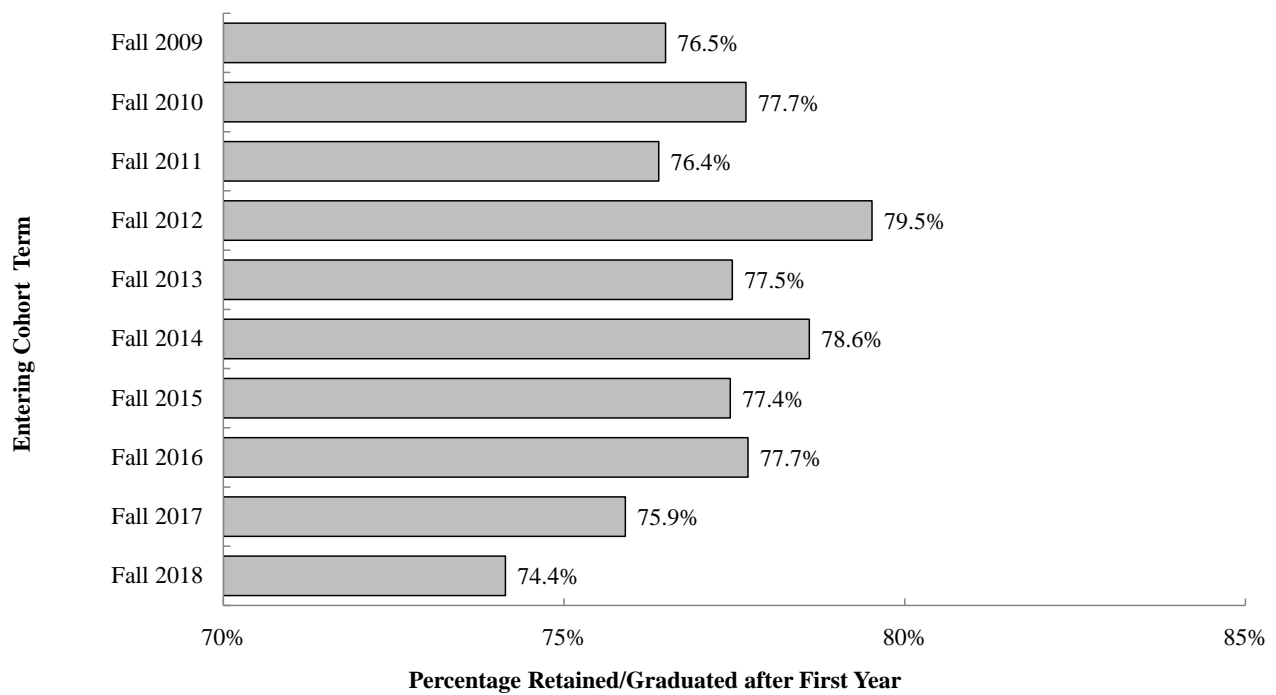

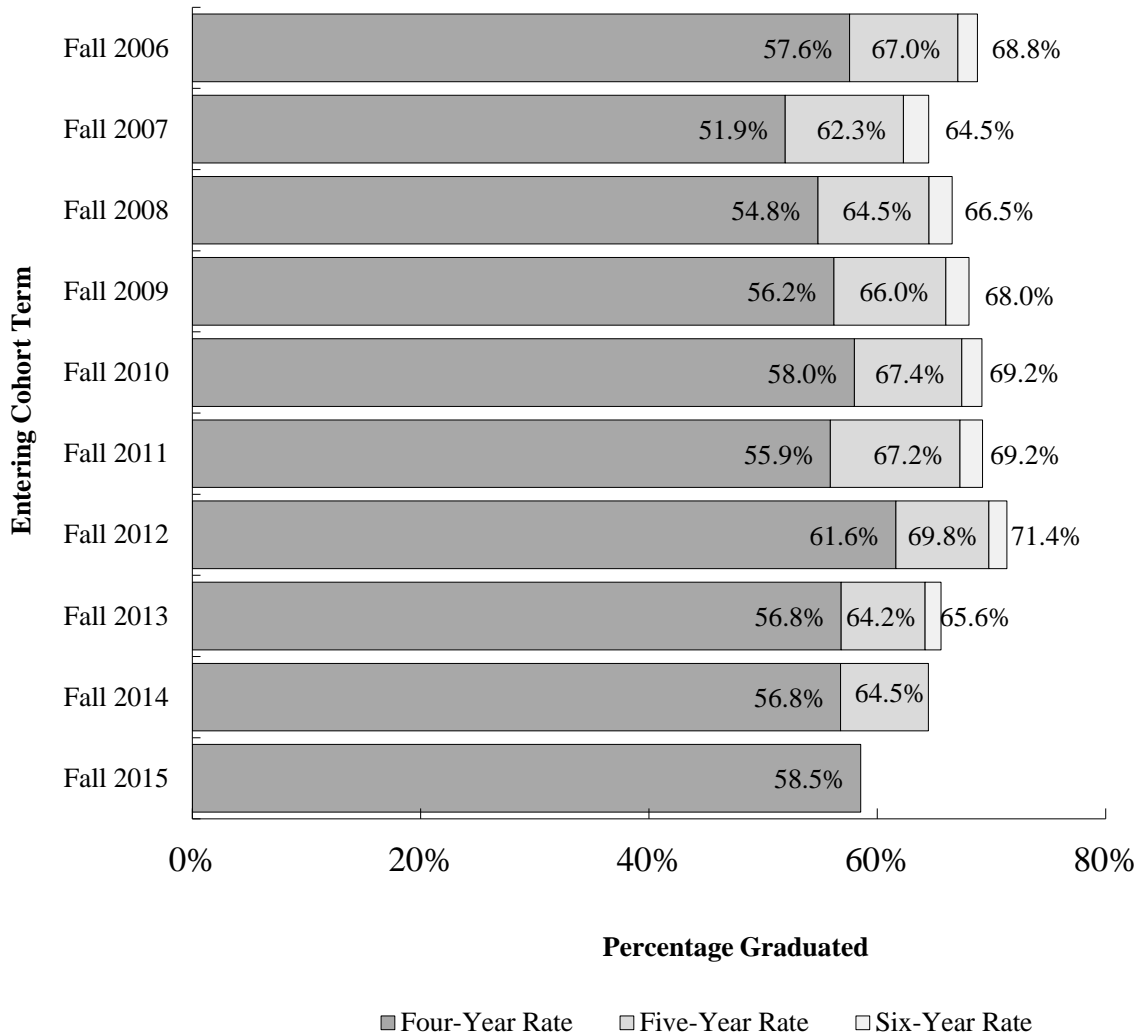
### First-Year Retention Rates of All New, Full-Time Freshmen Cohort Year Fall 2009 to Cohort Year 2018

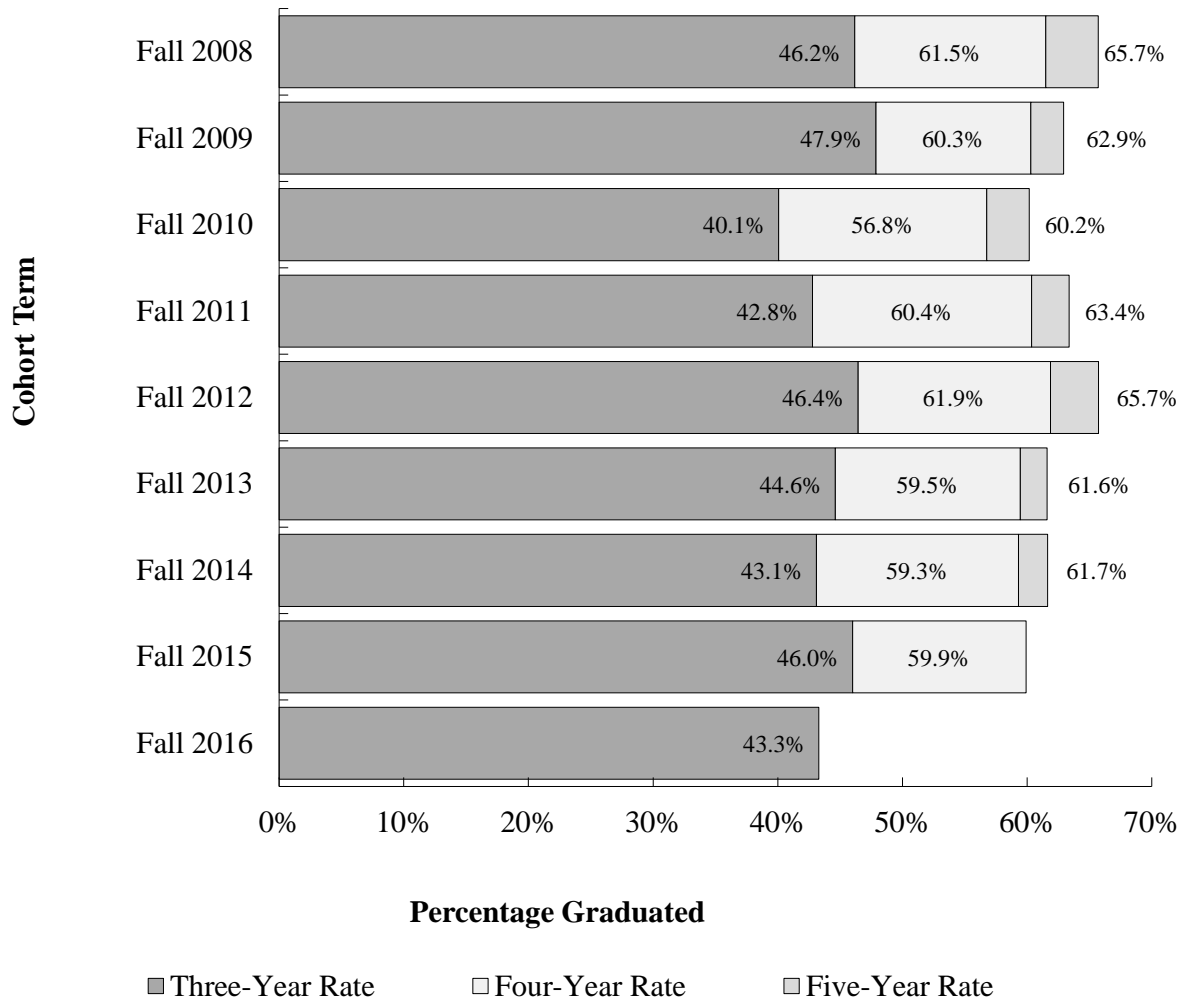

Full-time student - A student enrolled for 12 or more semester credits



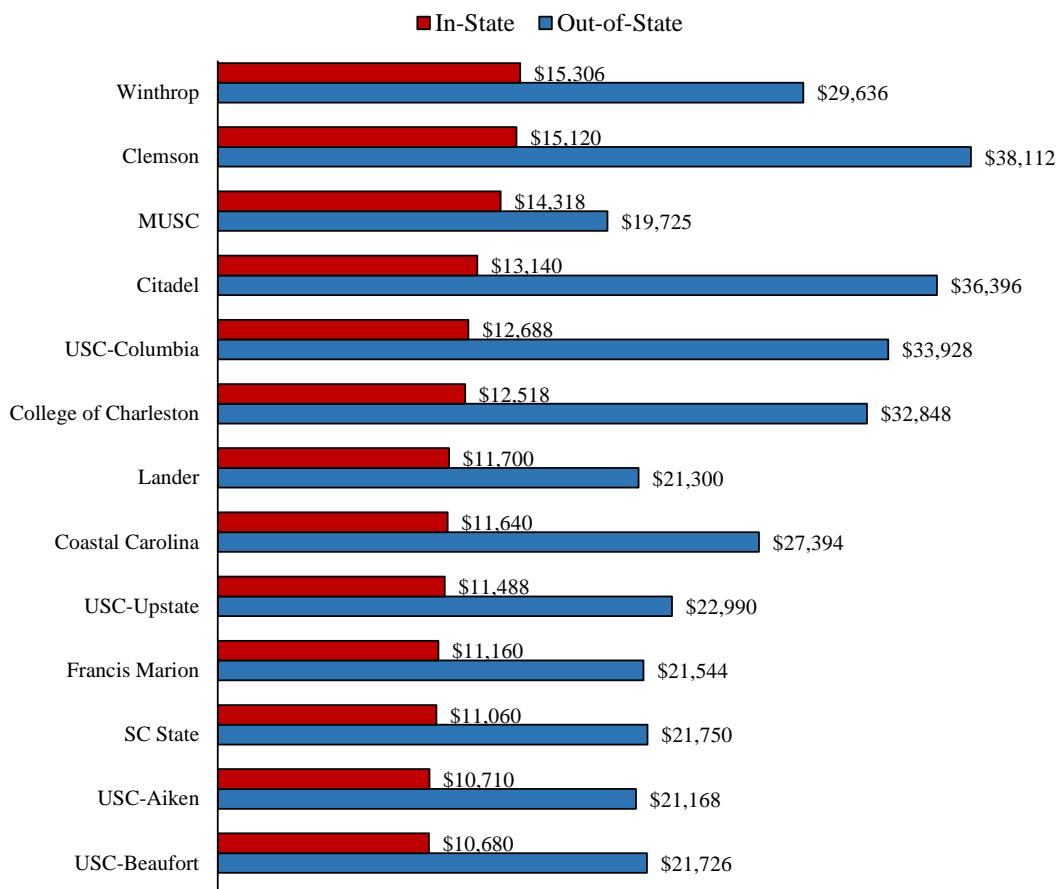

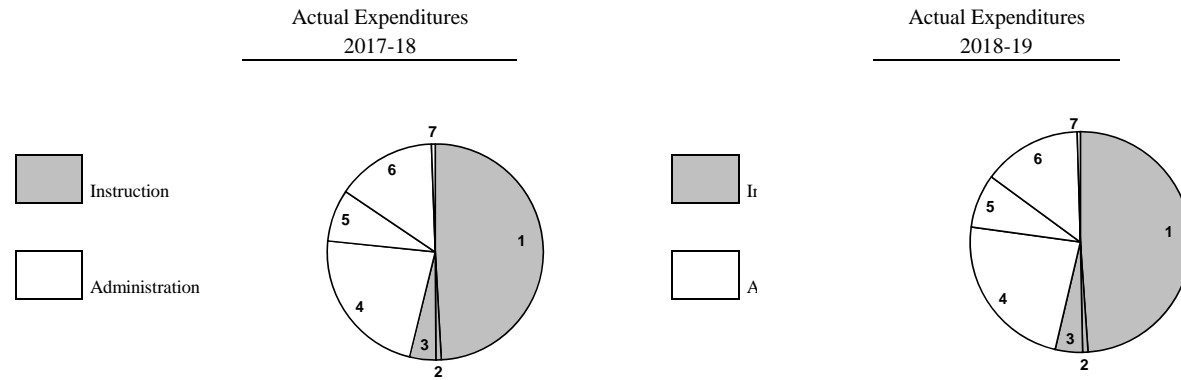
